Same and Different Look at photos of London in 1666 and the present day. What is the same? What is different?	Make me a Bakery! Create a bakery or street scene on Purple Mash. Can you program the objects to move? Could you include a fire?	Fire, Fire! Create a model of 1666 London on fire! Include houses, smoke and flames. You may also include part of the River Thames and The Tower of London near it.	Recycle Keep a tally of the things your household recycles for a week. Have a go at making bread and write the list of the ingredients that you use. Challenge: Can you write some instructions?	Sing me a Song Make up a song about the Great Fire of London.	What is it made from? Look at the labels in your clothes and write a list of materials that they are made from.

Mental Maths Focus this half term:

- To recognise odd and even numbers
- Rapid recall of number bond to 20 and number bonds to 100 e.g. $40 + \underline{\quad} = 100$
- Counting forward and back in 10s, 5s, 3s, and 2s.
- Recall multiplication and division facts for the 10, 5, 3 and 2 times table.

It would be great if you could continue to help your child read the time to the nearest 5 minutes on an analogue clock. It is something that needs to be practised regularly as it is really tricky!
