

<p><b>Watch out, Scary Weather About!</b></p> <p>Find out how to stay safe in dangerous weather conditions e.g. during a lightning storm. Draw a picture or make a poster to show people what they should or should not do.</p>	<p><b>Weather Forecast</b></p> <p>Watch the weather forecast on the television. Make a list of all the different words used to describe the weather. Challenge- Can you act out your own and record it?</p>	<p><b>Whatever the Weather</b></p> <p>Keep a weather diary for a week. Record the weather and temperature. Challenge: Find out what time the sun comes up and the sun sets. Write down these times for a week. Are the times always the same?</p>	<p><b>Mapping it out</b></p> <p>Create a map of a place local to you. It could be your street, your town or even the school. Don't forget to include your key.</p>	<p><b>Will it Float?</b></p> <p>If we were to travel to another country by boat, what would be the best material to make the boat from? Investigate which materials are waterproof and can float. Remember to make predictions before you start your investigation and have a conclusion at the end of your investigation!</p>
<p><b>Shapes, shapes and More Shapes</b></p> <p>Go for a shape hunt. Look around your house, garden and bedroom. How many different shapes can you see. Keep a record of the different shapes. Which shape did you see the most.</p>	<p><b>Picture for all Seasons</b></p> <p>Create a seasons picture that shows how a scene can change throughout our four seasons: Spring, Summer, Autumn and Winter. You could draw a tree, a house or a garden and quarter the picture to show the 4 seasons.</p>	<p><b>2s, 3s,5s and 10s</b></p> <p>Can you create a game to teach your friends to help them learn their timetables? It could be a number word search, snakes and ladders, matching cards or even a practical game. We will use them in our lessons to help us learn our timetables together</p>	<p><b>Poems, Poems and More Poems</b></p> <p>We will be looking at poems this half term. Can you create your own poems based on the weather? Some poems rhyme, other don't. Get creative and write about all the different weather types. Try to use onomatopoeia to describe the noises the different weathers can make.</p>	<p><b>Book Review</b></p> <p>Find your favourite book about weather. This could be a non-fiction or fiction book. Be ready to tell the class what it's about and why you like it. Challenge: Write a book review of it.</p>

You will receive 5 house points for every piece of optional homework you complete!

Mental Maths Focus this half term:

- Complete simple additions and subtractions in your head to 100, using whatever method works best for you. E.g.  $73+16=70+10+3+6$
- Counting forward and back in 10s, 5s, 3s, and 2s. from any number
- Recall multiplication and division facts for the 10-, 5-, 3- and 2-times table.

**It would be great if you could continue to help your child read the time to the nearest 5 minutes on an analogue clock. It is something that needs to be practised regularly as it is tricky!**
