Maths

Multiplication and Division/Length and Height

This half term, we are continuing to explore Multiplication and division. We are also solving problems involving multiplication and division, using materials, arrays, repeated addition, mental methods and multiplication and division facts, including problems in contexts. We will then look at measuring both length and height accurately in cm and m. We will use our knowledge of the four operations to help us with length and height word problems.

Key Skills

- Recall and use multiplication and division facts for the 2, 5 and 10 times tables,
- write mathematical statements using the multiplication (x), division (÷) and equals (=) signs.
- Measure objects in both centimetres and metres
- Choose the appropriate unit of measurement
- Order and compare length and height using cm and m.

Science

Animals including humans

We will learn about a variety of habitats and the plants and animals that live there. They will learn to tell the difference between things are living, never lived and dead.

Key Skills

Working scientifically

- Make observations of a local habitat and the creatures that live there.
- Investigate conditions in a local microhabitat.

Key objectives

- Explore different types of habitats.
- Distinguish between things that are living, dead and non-living.
- Explore examples of food chains learn how animals and plants depend on each other for food.
 - Name the process invented by John McAdam.

Geography

Our Country

In this unit the children will learn about the countries of the UK, developing learning beyond children's immediate environment and own locality to the UK in general. Children will explore the UK by looking at individual countries, capital cities, human and physical features.

Key Skills

- Use world maps, atlases and globes to identify the United Kingdom and its countries
- Use simple compass directions (north, south, east and west) and locational and directional language to describe the location of features and routes on a map

Art and Design

Key artist: Pablo Picasso

Genre: Drawing

During this topic we will be exploring the work of Pablo Picasso. We will be observing how art can portray emotions while considering the relationship between mood and colour. We will practise adding detail to line drawing and exploring shading. We will then plan our final drawing taking influence from Picasso's Rose and Blue period and finally we will evaluate our work.

Key Skills:

- Colouring in the line embedded
- Adding detail to line drawing
- Starting to explore shading
- Recognising relationship between mood and colour

P.E.

Football - Invasion Games

Our PE session will be delivered by Mr Thompson and will mainly take place outdoors. Please ensure your child's PE kit is appropriate for this.

Key Skills

- Recognise the best ways to score points and stop points being scored.
- Recognise how they work best with their partner.
- Use different rules and tactics for invasion games.
- Understand and develop tactics for attacking and defending.

Presenting Ideas
