Did you know that it takes 21 days for a hen egg to develop and hatch?



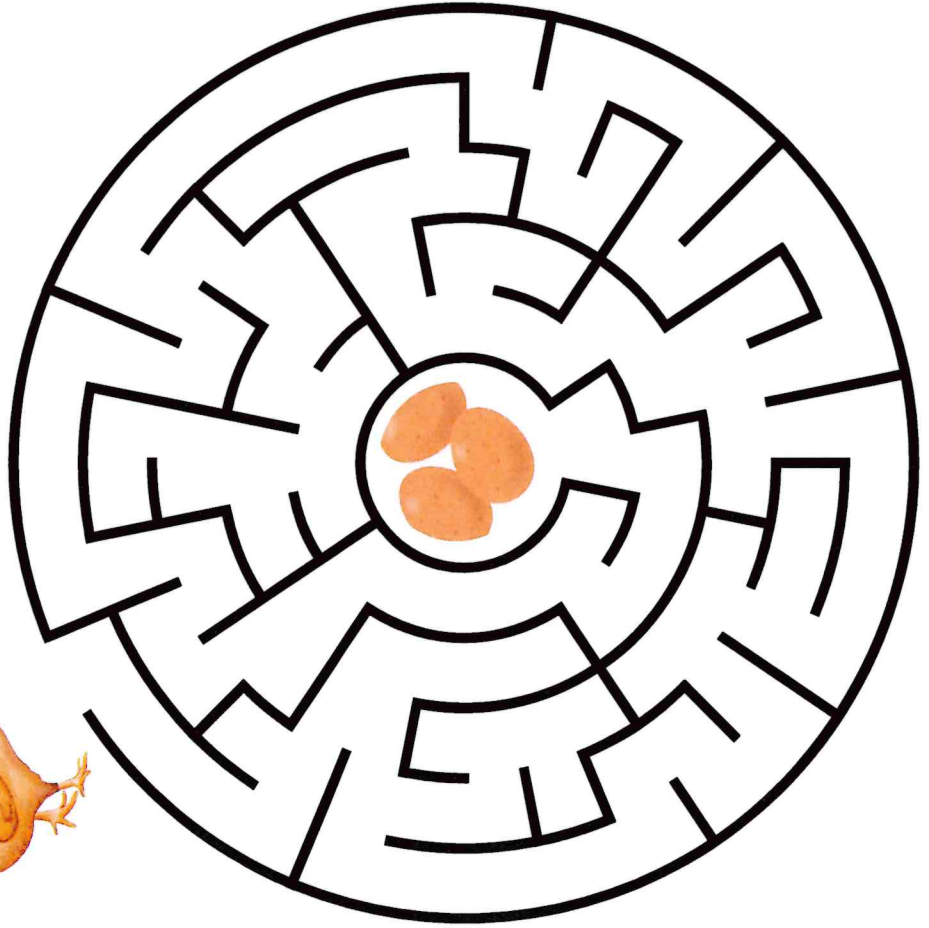
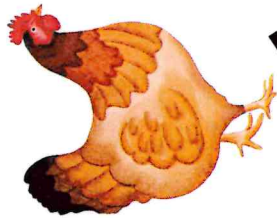

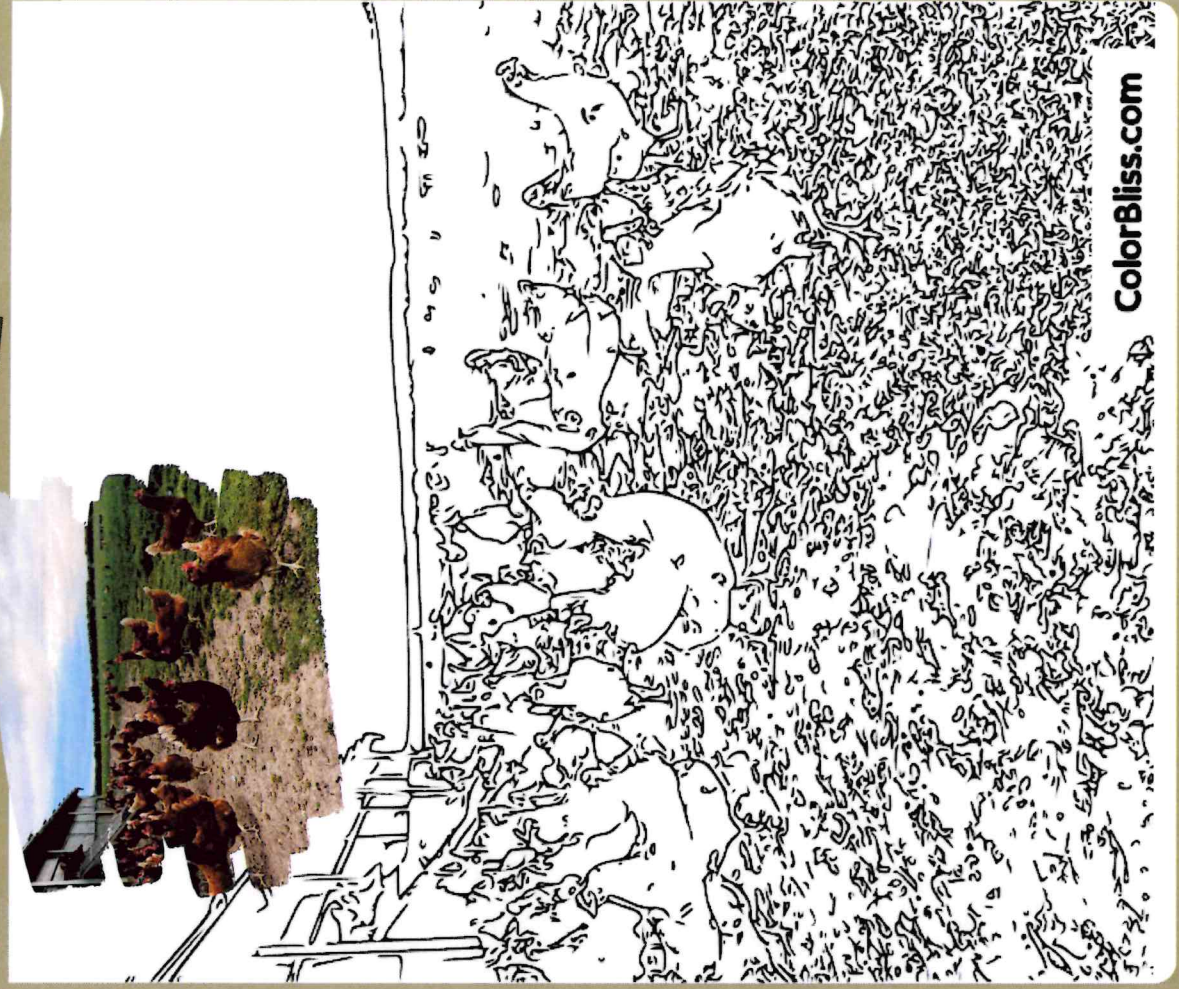
EGG HUNT MAZE

HAND PRINT HEN & CHICK



What you need:

Paper, paint (orange, black, yellow, brown, grey and green), paint brushes and pens/pencils

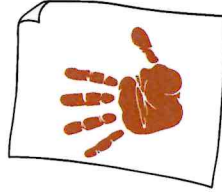
HEN

STEP 1



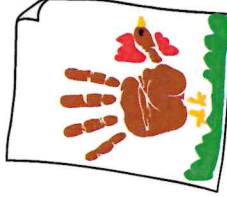
CHOOSE YOUR HEN COLOUR AND PAINT YOUR HAND WITH A PAINT BRUSH

STEP 2



PRESS YOUR HAND DOWN FIRMLY ONTO YOUR PIECE OF PAPER, YOUR THUMB WILL BE THE HENS HEAD

STEP 3



PAINT SOME GRASS, LEGS, A BEAK, EYES AND A HEN'S COMB AND WATTLES TO COMPLETE YOUR PICTURE



CHICK

STEP 1



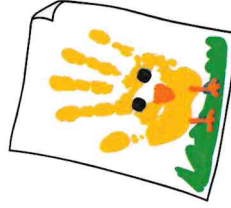
CHOOSE YOUR CHICK COLOUR AND PAINT YOUR HAND WITH A PAINT BRUSH

STEP 2



PRESS YOUR HAND DOWN FIRMLY ONTO YOUR PIECE OF PAPER, KEEPING YOUR HAND IN THE CENTRE OF THE PAGE

STEP 3



PAINT SOME EYES, LEGS AND BEAK FOR YOUR CHICK AND ADD SOME GRASS TO COMPLETE YOUR PICTURE



YOU CAN ADD SOME COLOURED FEATHERS TO YOUR HEN/CHICK PICTURE TO MAKE THEM EXTRA FLUFFY! WHY NOT ADD SOME SEEDS/CORN ON THE GRASS USING PVA GLUE



EXTRA DETAILS



CHOCOLATE EASTER NESTS



Ingredients

Nests

200 g milk chocolate (finely chopped)

200 g dark chocolate (finely chopped)

100 g unsalted butter

100 g golden syrup

6-8 Shredded Wheat (full-size)

Decoration

100-200g Easter chocolates



RECIPE

1. Start by crushing your Shredded Wheat into a large bowl. Leave to the side!
2. Add the butter and golden syrup to a pan, and heat gently whilst stirring occasionally until all the butter has melted (a grown up will need to do this/or give supervision)
3. Take it off the heat, and add in the finely chopped chocolate. Give it a good stir until the chocolate has melted into the syrup/butter mix.
4. Pour the chocolate mix over the Shredded Wheat and mix until all combined.
5. Using spoons, or an ice cream scoop - scoop onto a lined tray.
6. Decorate with mini eggs, approx. three per nest, and set in the fridge until they set and are solid.
7. Enjoy eating your delicious chocolatey nests!

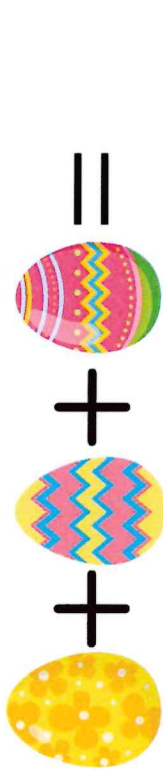


SPOT THE DIFFERENCE



EASTER EGG COUNTING

CRESS EGG HEAD



What you will need:

- 1 egg
- 2tsp of cress seeds
- cotton wool balls
- felt tip pens and googly eyes
- glue stick
- egg box or egg cup



STEP 1



CAREFULLY REMOVE THE TOP OF THE EGG LEAVING THE BOTTOM TWO THIRDS OF THE EGG INTACT, ENJOY EATING A DIPPY EGG OR SAVE IT FOR ANOTHER TIME

STEP 4



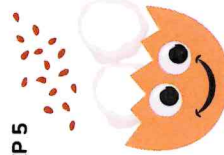
TAKE A COUPLE OF COTTON WOOL BALLS AND DIP THEM IN WATER, SQUEEZE OFF AN EXCESS

STEP 2



CAREFULLY WASH OUT THE EGG SHELL WITH WARM WATER AND LEAVE THEM TO DRY

STEP 5



PLACE THE DAMP COTTON WOOL BALLS INTO THE EGG SHELL AND SPRINKLE 1TSP OF CRESS SEEDS ON TOP

STEP 3

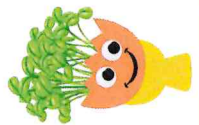


DECORATE THE SHELL USING FELT TIP PENS AND GOOGLY EYES, YOU CAN CREATE FUNNY/ANIMAL FACES

STEP 6



SIT YOUR CRESS HEAD IN AN EGG CUP/EGG BOX AND PLACE IN A SUNNY SPOT, IDEALLY A WINDOWSILL



IF THE COTTON WOOL DRIES OUT USE A SPOON TO ADD MORE WATER TO KEEP IT DAMP, WATCH TO SEE YOUR EGG HEAD GROW A FULL HEAD OF INCREDIBLE CRESS HAIR IN A FEW DAYS
